
Donation Ideas

Letting Travel Insurance

When traveling internationally, it is important to obtain travel insurance, especially when minors are involved. International travel can present risks, including medical emergencies, lost or stolen luggage, trip cancellations or interruptions, and personal liability issues. Without travel insurance, you may be responsible for covering the costs of these unexpected events.

Travel insurance can provide coverage for these risks, offering financial protection and peace of mind to your team members and their families. In addition, travel insurance policies often provide 24/7 emergency assistance, which can be invaluable when traveling in a foreign country, especially with minors. With emergency assistance, you can access medical care, legal assistance, or language interpretation services if needed, helping to ensure the safety and well-being of your team members while traveling internationally.

Overall, obtaining travel insurance is an important investment that can help protect you and its members from the risks associated with international travel.







Frequently asked Questions

Where do we stay?

We stay at comfortable local Airbnb's or hotels together as a group. You'll never need to worry about booking a room. Your payment includes all accommodation.

Do we have Wifi?

We will have wifi readily available **except** while at the beach. It's the perfect time to read and relax at the pool.

Can I go early or stay longer than the group?

Yes! We encourage you to make this trip everything you want it to be. We will ask that you meet us on a specific day/time and stay with us throughout the trip, but you are free to plan extra things before or after our time together.

Do I book my own flight?

We will share flight information with the group so they are welcome to fly with us. You are welcome to book your own flight and use your travel miles.

What is the weather like?

It is spring like weather where we visit. We encourage you to bring layers as it gets a bit chilly in the early mornings and evenings.

What is the food like?

The food is mostly delicious locally grown fresh food. When possible, we hire local women to prepare our meals and we will eat at local restaurants. You will most likely not eat anything from a box or can.

Do I need to get vaccinations?

No vaccinations are required at this time, but we do encourage you to talk to your physician prior to your trip.

How many people go on the trip?

Our trips range between 10 and 16 people.

What types of service projects do we do?

Depending on what time of year we are going, we may be assisting with gardening, painting or volunteering at a local school. There are projects for people of all skill levels.

Do I have phone service?

We'd encourage you to check in with your cell phone provider. You can pay for International calling so you can make calls while on the road. T-Mobile offers unlimited texting while in Guatemala, also, you can always use Wifi calling.

How much money should we bring? Can we use credit cards?

You are welcome to exchange your money before we leave or at the airport. If you'd like to exchange money in Guatemala please bring crisp, brand new \$100 bills. You will be able to use credit cards in Antigua, but cash everywhere else. Depending on your shopping style, \$300 should be a perfect amount for buying souvenirs and such.



Fundraising for your Irip

First tip when looking for fundraising ideas for your service vacation: Be creative and have fun. The possibilities are endless!

Here are some ideas:

- <u>Customize a t-shirt</u> for you to sell to friends and family (everyone loves a T-Shirt)
- Coffee (Utah residents) You can sell Organic Guatemalan Coffee for \$15+ a pound. We can purchase coffee wholesale for \$10 a bag and you can keep \$5.00.
- Auction Ask local businesses, artists and craftspeople to donate items for auction. A great event idea with children (a school group, for example), is to organize an art auction featuring the children's artwork.

Get busy in the kitchen:

- Make and Sell Your Own Cookie Dough \$7+ tub
- Dinner \$20+ Spaghetti is a low-cost meal that's easy to make in large amounts, and everyone loves it!
- Some other fun, low-cost meal options are pancakes and hotdogs.

Your favorite dish, soup or curry \$12+ tub – sell to neighbors and friends and include your delivery to make it extra special.

Papa Murphy's:

• Papa Murphy's is independently owned. Many owners are willing to work with you on fundraising ideas if you contact them.

Bake Sale:

This tried and true fundraising event is an American classic everyone loves.
Participants love to show off their culinary expertise, and check out the accomplishments of friends and neighbors.

eate a fundraising event:

 Collaborate with others. Host a talent show, art show, concert, auction using donated items from local businesses, 5K, tournament, dance party, cook off, car wash, luau, etc.

- Guatemalan Hot Chocolate a delicious treat that you could sell for \$20 when you return from your trip.
- Art Show you could print out your trip photos and sell them. Have an art show for local friends and family to come enjoy light refreshments and buy your artwork
- Organic Guatemalan Coffee a delicious treat you can sell in Guatemala and sell it for a profit when you return home.

Other:

- Send letters to friends, relatives, friends of the family, acquaintances, old teachers, co-workers, professors.
- Waive all holiday & birthday gifts; request financial gifts instead (to use towards your experience).
- Network via social media platforms.
- · Check with local businesses.
- Check with your employer. Some companies are willing to provide financial support for a service experience if they feel it will add value to their organization.
